The 2024 Tarrant County York Rite Honoree: Right Excellent, Right Illustrious John A., Hughes



Companion **Hughes** was born in Corsicana, Texas and grew up in Arlington, Texas where he resides today. He is a product of the Arlington Independent School District and graduated from The University of Texas at Arlington with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mechanical Engineering.

John is currently employed by Lockheed Martin Corporation in Fort Worth as a Software Engineer. He and **Becky** were married in 1975 and have two daughters, both living in the area. They have five grandchildren. John was raised in Arlington Lodge No. 438 in 1972.

During the spring of 1973 he joined Arlington Chapter No. 376 R. A. M., serving as High Priest in 1992-93, Arlington Council No. 317 R. & S. M., serving as Thrice Illustrious Master in 1993-94.

He is a member of Arlington Commandery No. 107. John affiliated with Panther City Lodge No. 1183 in 1991 and served as Worshipful Master in 1994-95, followed by 10 years as Secretary.

He is a Past President of the Masters, Wardens, and Secretaries Association of the 64th Masonic District. He was appointed District Deputy Grand Master by G.M. **Harry G. Cunningham** in 1998.

John was appointed to the Fraternal Relations Committee of the Grand Lodge and is served as its chairman. He joined the Fort Worth Scottish Rite in 1979 and received the 32° KCCH in 1985. For his service he was Coroneted a 33° Inspector General Honorary in 2005.

He served as Treasurer and currently is serving on Finance Committee. He is the 21° Degree Master. He has been a member of Moslah Shrine Center since 1978.

He is a Past Sovereign Master of Tejas Council of the Allied Masonic Degrees having received the Red Branch of Eri.

In Trinity York Rite College he is a Past Governor and Past Treasurer. He is an Associate Regent of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America, where he served as **Deputy Grand Governor** in Texas for four years.

Companion Hughes was installed into Saint Timothy Conclave in 1988 and advanced through the officer line to serve as Sovereign in 2002. He was commissioned **Intendant General of the Division of Texas Northern in 2013**, serving for 10 years.

John is a Senior DeMolay, having been a member of Arlington Chapter, where is served as Master Councilor in 1968. He was elected to the DeMolay State Executive Committee. From DeMolay he holds the Degree of Chevalier, the Cross of Honor, and the Legion of Honor.

Companion Hughes is currently serving as the Right Excellent and Right Illustrious Grand Treasurer of the **Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Texas** and the **Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Texas** serving since 2019.
He served as DDGM in 2018.

John is a VI° member of San Jacinto Assemblage of the Worshipful Society of Freemasons, Rough Masons, Wallers, Slaters, Paviors, Plaisterers and Bricklayers (a. k. a., the Operatives).

He is Secretary and VIII grade member in Texas College of the S.R.I.C.F.


